What Are Eyelash Extensions?

They are semi-permanent individual synthetic eyelashes that are made to look like a naturally curved eyelash. Synthetic lashes respond better to wear and tear than any other material and have the least chance of an allergic reaction with human skin. Lash extensions made from animal hair, such as mink, may cause an allergic reaction for some people. The lashes vary in length and thickness. The choice is yours! Eyelash extensions are bonded to your individual lashes with an adhesive developed specifically for eyelash extensions, one extension at a time, adding length and fullness to your own lashes. You cannot use an eyelash curling tool on eyelash extensions. They are already curled. Eyelash extensions should only be applied by a certified professional.

The Application Process—Eyelash extensions are applied while you are in a reclined position. Your eyelashes must be very clean and free from mascara the day of application. Your bottom lashes will be covered by tape to prevent the bonded lashes from touching them during application. You must keep your eyes closed while the eyelash extensions are being bonded to your lashes. Application time for the extensions is 2–3 hours. Often clients will fall asleep while the lashes are being applied. Touch ups can take as long as 1 1/2 hours depending upon how many lashes you have shed.

Caring For Your New Lashes—It is very important that you do not expose your new lashes to water or steam for 12–24 hours to ensure a strong bond. After 24 hours, your new lashes will be resistant to water, sweat and tears. Do not rub your eyes or pull on the extensions;

be gentle. You will be given a brush to use on your new lashes. Brush them from the underside. You can clean your lashes with a mix of baby shampoo and water (1 part shampoo to 4 parts water). Clean them gently with your fingers. It is very important that you never use any product on your eyelash extensions that contains glycols (such as Propylene Glycol), organic solvents, or alcohol.

Can I Apply Mascara to My New Lashes? - One advantage of having eyelash extensions is that you won't need to use mascara on your top eyelashes anymore. If you want to use mascara, you must use a water-based mascara. Never use waterproof mascara because the ingredients will wear down the bonding of the eyelash extensions.

How Often Should I Get Touchups? - Your natural lashes shed every 60–90 days and are replaced with the growth of new lashes. Since eyelash extensions are applied to your individual lashes, you can expect to lose 1/3 of the lashes in 2–4 weeks. At this point, touchups are needed to replace the lashes that have completed their life cycle. Touchups are less expensive than a full application. However, if you wait longer than 2–4 weeks and have lost the majority of your eyelash extensions, you may need a full set of eyelash extensions and will be charged the full price of an application.

Are Eyelash Extensions Removable? - Yes, by using an adhesive remover made for eyelash extensions. Removing the lashes is done one by one, just as applying them is done one by one. There is a fee for removal.

Is There Anyone Who Should Not Have Eyelash Extension Applied? - Yes, clients who have alopecia, are

undergoing chemotherapy, or who do not have natural lashes of their own. Individuals whose natural lashes are curly are not candidates for eyelash extensions. Eyelash extensions are designed for clients who have naturally short straight lashes. If the natural lash is curly, the eyelash extension will not lay against the natural lash and bond properly.

If you are a cancer patient, you need to wait until you have completed chemo and your lashes have begun to grow again. Your new lashes will be weaker and thinner than they were originally during this new growth period. To make your natural lashes look thicker during this time of new growth, thin eyelash extensions can be applied. As your natural lashes grow stronger, thicker eyelash extension can be applied.

If you are experiencing any medical conditions of your eyes, you will need to wait until your eyes are healthy before having eyelash extensions applied. This includes bacterial and viral infections such as pink eye.

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
